We want to reassure you that our older residents will still receive the services they need. The Commonwealth Government will appoint new providers for Manningham. We will then work with them to ensure a smooth transition for our residents.

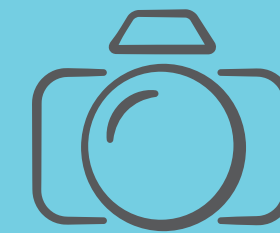

Building our resilience through water management

Help prepare for our future by sharing how you use and conserve water, and why it's important to you. You can do this through completing our water future survey.

Unfinished Business

Wednesday 24 May to Saturday 29 July

Following his birth in north-western Victoria in 1960, Latja Latja and Narungga child, John Baxter, received treatment for Spina Bifida in Melbourne and was fostered to a non-Aboriginal family in the eastern suburbs. He didn't see his birth family again until his late teens.

Uncle John's experience is one of 30 powerful stories from First Nations people living with disabilities, explored by photographic artist, Belinda Mason, in her global exhibition *Unfinished Business*, now on show at Manningham Art Gallery.

By using depth to create connection, Belinda's portraits provoke intense emotion in audiences. They deliberately touch on raw nerves to raise awareness of Australia's social and political history and the policies that led to exceptionally high disability rates in First Nations Peoples.

Unfinished Business was born from a 2013 World Health Organisation project in Geneva. As part of the exhibition, visitors hear the voices of those featured as they share the personal stories behind the images. These inspiring stories of strength are told through film and written word.

In 2014, *Unfinished Business* was presented as part of the Australian Government's contribution at the United Nations World Conference on Indigenous Persons in

New York. Uncle John attended with Belinda, to open the exhibition and share his lived experiences with the audience.

"It was a tremendous honour to speak in front of a group which included American Indians – people who have walked a similar, parallel journey. To swap notes, share together, grieve together, and also to hope together," Uncle John said.

It's particularly meaningful to Uncle John that *Unfinished Business* has returned home to Australia and is being hosted by the Manningham Art Gallery.

The exhibition is now just around the corner from his friends, family and community, so they can experience it for themselves in an intimate, inviting and accessible space.

"I became involved in *Unfinished Business* through the First Peoples Disability Network because I realised how far this project was going to reach – communities not only in Australia but around the world.

"The people Belinda had reached out to are Elders and significant leaders within their communities; they are truly outstanding individuals. I felt she had captured 'lightening in bottle' bringing those amazing personalities together."

Uncle John believes those featured will inspire others to overcome adversity, achieve their goals, become leaders and foster a better understanding of how Australia's treatment of First Nations Peoples contributed to participants' stories and many more like them.

"If we accept the positions some of the participants have been put in, it is a poor reflection on society and humanity... It's a tough journey, and the wounds run deep. But being able to push through the barriers gives you strength, the capacity and the ability to continue taking steps forward."

In his lifetime, Uncle John has seen the referendum granting First Nations people the right to be included in census data, the right to vote, and the introduction of The Acknowledgement of Country. He's proud to see the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flag flying high on buildings, and lands such as K'gari (Fraser Island) returning to their traditional names.

"I feel that momentum is building. We're having a significant impact, which is really encouraging. It's amazing to see the (results from a) lifetime of work our Elders have done.

"It has been extraordinarily hard; we have to continue to be grateful. The elders have pushed through such adversity to improve the lives of not just Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, but society, the community, and Australia. It's humbling, and I'm glad to be here at this time."

Uncle John says there's still a way to go; he and Belinda believe *Unfinished Business* can unravel the narrative that continues to plague our culture around disability.

"We often see disability as a deficit. We see the equipment, the service provision, the infrastructure. Think about how disability is still portrayed in film, and their roles played by people without disability. We need more realistic expression. Equal opportunity has to be more than documentation, it has to be everyday life.

"This exhibition turns (this narrative) on its head. These people are leaders. They're inventive and far more than you thought they had the capacity to be – they should be celebrated!"

Everyone included at kinder

Did you know we support local kindergartens to make sure children of all backgrounds and needs can get involved?

This is a free service, funded through the Department of Education. It's available to all early childhood services in Manningham that operate a funded three or four-year-old kindergarten program, either at a stand-alone kindergarten, within a long day care program or a school.

Preschool Field Officers (PSFOs) are qualified Early Childhood Teachers with extra training to support the learning of children with diverse needs.

The officers don't work directly with the children - they work to support the teaching team. They help to build understanding and skills when working with children and families where learning needs or family circumstances may need a different approach or extra support.

Officers visit kindergartens to discuss children's individual needs on referral. If you think this might benefit your child, speak to their kindergarten teacher about it.

The PSFO can meet with your child's teacher during their planning time or visit the kindergarten group. Your child and other children and families are unaware this service is being provided for your child.

The PSFO may observe your child so they can see what's working well for them and what they are finding challenging. They can then discuss modifications that might better support learning and social interaction with educators. They can also recommend other community support the family can access, or training or reading for the teaching team.

Any written communication shared with the teacher following a consultation with the PSFO is also shared with the family. This ensures open communication and supports consistent approaches.

If you are worried about your child's development, or about their participation or inclusion in the kindergarten program, talk to your child's kindergarten teacher. If you think they need extra support, you could suggest they make a referral to the Preschool Field Officer.

Get started with FOGO

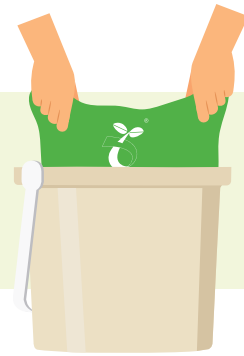
Your new Food Organics Garden Organics (FOGO) service is here, starting from Monday 3 July in Manningham.

With FOGO your food and garden waste will go together into your existing green lid bin, which will become your FOGO bin.

If you have a Council waste service, you will have recently received your FOGO starter kit including a kitchen caddy and a roll of 150 lime green compostable liners. The caddy is designed to help you collect and carry your kitchen food scraps out to your green lid FOGO bin.

How to get started and use your FOGO kitchen caddy

- 1 Line your kitchen caddy with one of the certified compostable liners provided



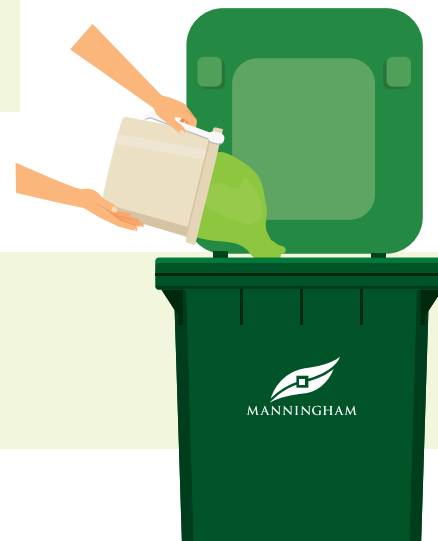
- 2 Keep your kitchen caddy close by when preparing food and cleaning up



- 3 Collect and store your food waste in your kitchen caddy



- 4 Empty your kitchen caddy into your green lid FOGO bin



- 5 Place your green lid FOGO bin out for collection weekly



Preventing contamination in the FOGO process

Once your green lid FOGO bin is collected from your kerbside, it is taken to an organics facility for processing and made into high-grade compost. This compost will then be used in gardens and farms across Victoria.

As part of this process, it's important for all of us to make sure that only food and garden waste and our certified lime green compostable liners are being placed into your green lid FOGO bin.

Items like stickers, packaging, plastic and biodegradable products will contaminate and disrupt the composting process – here's some tips to make sure they stay out of your FOGO bin.

Things to remember with FOGO:

- If you can eat it or it grew in the ground, it can go into your green lid FOGO bin. Tea bags can't go into your FOGO bin as many include micro plastics, the string and staple also disrupt the composting process.
- Remove stickers and rubber bands from fruit and vegetables before placing into your FOGO bin.
- Make sure any plastic wrap or packaging is removed from food waste before it goes into your caddy or bin.
- Biodegradable products such as bin liners and food packaging products and bags cannot go in your FOGO bin as they will not fully break down in the composting process.
- Only lime green, certified compostable liners can go into your FOGO bin.

About compostable liners

Our compostable liners are Australian certified, made from vegetable material and are completely plastic free. These liners completely break down in the composting process.



Where can I get more?

Like the roll you received with your FOGO starter kit, a free roll of 150 compostable liners (approximately one year's supply) will be made available to Manningham households each year. These will be available for collection from May next year.

You can also purchase certified compostable liners from major supermarkets. Just remember to make sure they are lime green and have the certification symbols shown.

Have you ever wondered how we choose street trees for locations around Manningham?

Our new Street Tree Planting Guide outlines how we will choose the trees we use in our street tree planting program.

It maps out 18 local precincts, each with their own selection of trees. The tree selection (or palette) is based on the character of the precinct.

To develop the guide, we reviewed the character of each of the 1,820 streets in Manningham.

The new guide is also in line with the *Melbourne Metropolitan Urban Forest Strategy, Living Melbourne: Our Metropolitan Urban Forest*. It aims to enhance canopy cover, improve mental and physical wellbeing and protect and enhance biodiversity and habitat corridors.

We will start using our new guide as we begin our Street Tree Planting Program for 2024. We want to make sure we are consistent in our tree planting program and that trees selected are suited to the environment.

Many of our street trees begin their life with our plant nursery team at the Council Depot. Here, we propagate Indigenous (local to Manningham) and native (local to Australia) trees from seed.

We collect seeds from the healthiest of tree species from our local parks and streets. Our plant nursery team then nurture the plants until they're ready to be planted in local streets round our community
